The SSIQ is a 33 item measure comprised of four subscales; the Cronbach's alpha for the total scale is .909. The subscales of the SSIQ represent the identified attributes of the concept self-comfort. Although the Cronbach's alpha for each of the subscales are: .892, .869, .836, and .665, respectively. The subscales are not designed for separate or independent use.
